Gaining knowledge on a key health issue

UNAIDS Youth Officers and interns from the United Nations presented information on the steady progress being made on the battle against HIV/Aids in Thailand.

All 117 current GAC students in levels 1-3 attended the session in the seminar room, where they found out how incidence rates for many at-risk groups in Thailand are now stabilising, but also what more needs to be done. They also took notes on what terminology is more appropriate to use in their essays.

Overcoming some initial shyness, a few braver students took up the presenters on their offer to ask questions about the nature of the disease and how it is transmitted. All Y. 12 students received a flash-drive at the end of the presentation.
